


The motorway section Hörbranz and Hohenems (A14) is exempt from toll (as of July 2025).





Food and Drink ¶

Enjoying culinary delights is always one of the most sensual ways of exploring new places. The traditional food here is healthy, homely and down-to-earth, from fresh *Lake Constance fish* to a classic local veal *Schnitzel*. For an alpine region, fine cheese is also of great importance and can be found in a local *Lumpensalat* and of course the ever-present *Kässpätzle*. There's even a distinctive breakfast dish to try in the form of *Riebel*, a corn-based hearty variation on porridge.

Traditionally, the dishes are featured on many menus in the region. The list of good restaurants, cafes, bars, and ice cream parlors is so extensive that for simplicity's sake, you can find them all online.

Vorarlberger Kässpätzle with brown butter and fried onions

Ingredients for 4 people

500 g Vorarlberger Spätzle Mehl (flour) 7 Eggs 200 ml Ländle Milch (milk) 50 ml Mineral water 400 g Ländle Spätzlekäs

(cheese mixture or 190 g grated Vorarlberger Bergkäse, 160 g of 12-month matured Ländle Räßkäse, 50 g Ländle Rheintaler Käse)

50 g Ländle Sura Käs 60 g Ländle butter Fried onions:
3 Onions

30 g Vorarlberger Mehl (flour) 20 g Paprika (sweet)

Instructions:

Heat the Ländle butter in a pan until it's brown and has a nutty aroma. Place the Vorarlberger Spätzlemehl (flour), salt, pepper and nutmeg in a bowl. Add the Ländle Milch (milk), mineral water and eggs and mix with a wooden spoon to form a firm dough. Beat the dough until it starts to bubble. Be sure to have a pan with plenty of boiling salted water ready. Press the dough through a *Spaetzler* and bring to boil. Scoop the spaetzle into a bowl using a slotted spoon – you can leave a little of the spaetzle water behind to keep them moist. Sprinkle the grated cheese mixture on top and mix into the spaetzle with a wooden spoon until it starts to become stringy. Pour the brown butter on top.

Fried onions:

Cut the onions into fine rings using a slicer. Place in a bowl, dust with flour and paprika powder and mix well until the onions have absorbed everything. Fry in hot oil at 180 °C and drain on kitchen paper. Sprinkle the onions over the Kässpätzle.

Over the past few years, a growing number of young entrepreneurs are dedicating their businesses to traditional pursuits such as gin and whiskey production, with several prizes testament to their tenacity and success. The same can be said of chocolatiers here, who are winning accolades from near and far. The region's weekly farmers' markets are equally dedicated to their time-honoured trade and a source of healthy, regional and seasonal products. Wherever you buy here, you can look forward to diverse and quality products with a respect for nature.











#zäm: Cooperation and quality

Some catch fish, some grow organic flowers, and some have dedicated themselves to pig farming. Yet others cultivate vegetables or dry fruit which are then added to high-quality chocolate or simply enjoyed on their own. What connects all these producers is an uncompromising commitment to quality and responsible production. **Michael Kühne from Lisilis Biohof** speaks for many of his peers when he says: "We want to manage this piece of land in such a way that we can pass it on in an intact condition at some point." In the region's farmers stores can be found an assortment of seasonal delights such as milk, yoghurt, cream cheeses, and fresh vegetables.

In addition to direct sales, cooperations with local businesses are hugely important for producers here. Quality is particularly appreciated in the restaurant trade, and trust is imperative for this. **Mario Fitzek from the Löwen guesthouse in Nofels**, for example, says: "With the products that we use in the business, I want to regularly check for myself that the quality is right in all areas." This would be difficult if you were buying wholesale, but is no issue if you personally know the suppliers.

Such cooperations are not merely limited to the interactions of producers and restaurant owners. A particularly exciting example of collaboration is that of Sanjay Bösch and Nikolai Jochum. The latter grows herbs, fruit and veg at Klostergarten in Bregenz among other places, while the former in turn uses the products to produce fermented goods. What unites them is a love for food products, and the fact that high quality requires plenty of time and dedication. As **Sanjay Bösch from Bacteriosapiens** says: "I don't understand all these 20-minute cookbooks. We should pay attention to food and what we eat. It's not something to be rushed." The same can be said for many other collaborations - the focus is rarely on short-term success alone. Rather, it is about long-term and sustainable cooperation.
